



Audition Requirements for the Performing/Visual Arts Programme

Music:

Candidates will be required to present a recital of two contrasting pieces of music. Candidates will also be given a test in general musicianship including aural perception.

Drama:

Candidates will be required to present a 3-5 minute monologue given to them in advance by Queen Margaret College. Candidates will be required to learn it and block it. (i.e. stage movements for the performance are planned.)

Visual Arts:

Candidates will be required to submit a folio of three of their most recent works. These may be the same as presented on the CD. Candidates will also deliver a 3-5 minute oral presentation on their folio.

Conditions & Regulations of the Year 9 Performing and Visual Arts Scholarship

Applications close on Wednesday 12 May 2010 at 5:00pm

The auditions for shortlisted candidates will be held on Tuesday 18 May 2010 between 9:00am-4:00pm

The Year 9 Performing/Visual Arts Scholarship is awarded for 3 years and provides 33.3% of tuition fees per year for the scholarship duration.

Candidates are required to base their application on **one** of the Performing Arts, either Art or Music or Drama.

Candidates will be expected to perform at an outstanding level in their chosen discipline.

There is an expectation that the recipient of the scholarship will participate fully in the Queen Margaret College curricular and extra curricular programmes of their chosen discipline.

A non refundable acceptance fee of \$450.00 is payable on acceptance of the scholarship for a student who is not currently enrolled at Queen Margaret College.

Should the diligence, progress or behaviour of the scholarship recipient prove to be unsatisfactory, then the Principal and Board of Governors reserve the right to terminate the scholarship.

All candidates must be New Zealand citizens or residents. Those candidates who are not currently enrolled at Queen Margaret College must provide documentary evidence of New Zealand birth, citizenship or residency.

A copy of the student's most recent school report must accompany the application unless currently enrolled at Queen Margaret College.

Candidates are required to attend the audition at the College on the designated day and time in order to be considered.

The Board of Governors reserves the right not to award any or all of the scholarships offered if the candidates do not reach the required standards.

The DVD or CD submitted will remain the property of the College.

The allocation of scholarships will be the decision of the Principal and no correspondence will be entered into.
