




Passionate about mentoring, Chris supports young creatives in finding commercial pathways for their talent.

Dr Nicola Smith is a Respiratory Specialist at Wellington Hospital, where she diagnoses and treats patients with lung conditions such as asthma and lung cancer. Her day can involve anything from attending emergencies, diagnosing patients, teaching medical students to perform bronchoscopies (a procedure that lets her look inside the lungs!), and overseeing research trials.

Nicola completed her medical degree at the University of Auckland before training in internal medicine and respiratory medicine in New Zealand, Australia and England. A career highlight has been leading international research into techniques for reducing breathlessness in people with lung cancer, establishing procedures that are now used internationally. She is passionate about breathing and how vital it is for everyday life. Nicola helps patients of all ages improve their breathing and manage their health.
