Course details

The aim of the course at Year 11 is to gain an understanding of New Zealand and international events that were of significance to New Zealanders. For the internal assessments students research a protest movement and communicate their findings in appropriate formats. Topics studied are Rights and Protest in the USA and New Zealand and the World at War with a focus on the war in the Pacific 1941-1945.

Homework expectations

To achieve at a high level in this subject, students are expected to complete some homework during the week. Homework might include:
