### Course details

The aim of the course at year 12 is to gain an understanding of New Zealand and international events that were of significance to New Zealanders. Students study the early years of the Cold War (1945 to 1963) and the Vietnam War. For the internal assessments students research particular aspects of these topics and communicate their findings in appropriate formats.

### Homework expectations
